I. Introductions

II. Status update on the Arroyo Seco Ecosystem Restoration Feasibility Study

- a. Public Works provided an update on the study:
 - i. Corps has completed the existing conditions analysis
 - ii. Identified the following alternatives to be analyzed for each reach (see attached):
 - 1. Low-flow channels
 - 2. Notched side walls with parallel low-flow channels
 - 3. Reinforced concrete pipe (RCP) culverts with parallel low-flow channels
 - 4. Floodplain benching
 - 5. Sheetpile bank protection with floodplain benching
 - iii. Corps is looking at the footprints of these alternatives throughout the study area to identify constrains and practicality of each measure
 - iv. The next step in the study is to complete the Tentatively Selected Plan (TSP) which introduces a combination of measures that provide the most habitat restoration with the lowest implementation cost
 - v. The TSP milestone is currently scheduled for October 31, 2016
 - vi. Local sponsors will have the opportunity to review and provide input on the plan once the Corps releases the TSP
 - vii. Local sponsors will have the option to choose a locally preferred plan and cover the difference in cost
 - viii. Public Works will work with the local partners and other stakeholders to hold public meetings upon the release of the TSP

III. CASA's future

- a. CASA was formed in 2001 as a Technical Advisory Committee for the Corps' study
- b. Since then CASA has looked at different topics such as water resources, water quality, recreational programs, and transportation within the Arroyo Seco watershed
- c. Group discussed the future of CASA and agreed that:
 - As-needed focused meetings on different watershed topics would be more effective
 - ii. CASA should serve as a Technical Review Committee for projects within the watershed
 - iii. Other key organizations such as US Forest Service, Foothill Municipal Water District, Council of Watershed Health, and participating cities should be encouraged to attend CASA meetings

- iv. The group will meet on a quarterly basis until the Corps' TSP is released and then decide if meetings should be scheduled on an as-needed basis
- v. Future meetings will revisit the original vision of CASA and establish new goals for the future
